ANTECEDENT OF GC:-

1. Few years back some youngsters of Bankatia village started to show their interest in social works, they voluntarily helped impecunious people round them. Moderately they helped the needy people of their neighbor villages. Those youngsters were being praised by the villagers for their good deeds, conversely there was Mr. Ganeswar Mishra a benevolent man gave a piece of his land to those youngsters. They decided to build a club and named it as GANESWAR CLUB (GC). Then the club was legalized on 19th September in 1980 and registered in Nehru Yuba Kendra to do youth activities, for more improvements it collaborated with OREDA,BBSR (smokeless Chula activities) and also joined in NEAC (national environment awareness campaign) scheme of the ministry of environment forests and climate change , govt. of India. In 1987 GC registered in FCRA to get financial assistance from abroad. It was the first time to get ZEE support from Gandhi peace center for engaging in socio economic activities. After that GC received support from TDH (Terre Des Homes), CWS, HIVOS & GOVT. and kept developing and reached its complete form. It has been working for approximately 30,000 families of Hindol block, Dhenkanaldistrict ,Odisha. Now GC is also helping people from different districts like cuttack etc.

2. AIMS & OBJECTIVES OF GC:-

It focuses on raising mass awareness, motivate people to combat the miseries of life to improve quality of life adhering to their initiatives towards ecological balance and economic development. Development of community organization, basically GC focuses on sustainable developments as follows,

3. JDF[JivDaya Foundation]

Jiv daya foundation has been a partner to us since -----, under this partnership there are two types of project going on: -one is milk project and another one is biscuit project. Biscuit project which has certainly been closed from this march-24. Milk project is still continuing in 9 villages, in this project the Malnutrition child will get 15 g Amul spray (150ml) and 2 pieces of biscuits everyday in a form of nutrition. JDF also provide 50 kg rice to every milk project child. Milk project is being continues in total 9 villages with 261 beneficiaries.

Sikhadeuri 15 years old girl lived in Kalipoi village of Nabkisorpur Gram panchayat. She belongs from a poor family. Her father ChaitanyaDehuri is a daily labourer and mother SubhasiniDehuri is a housewife. Despite the adverse circumstances at home, Sikha completed his education up to 8th Class.

After completing 8th grade she didn't want to enroll in class 9. After knowing about that Seemabiswal (a worker of GC) convinced her and her family she discussed with the Head Master of Fasigaan high school and enrolled her in that school. But after some days Sikha was not going to school. When Seemabiswal visited Fasigaan high school the head master of the school informed her about the irregularities of "Sikhaa".

Learned about the Sikha's irregularities, Seema visits Sikha's house and met with Sikha and her parents. After some chatting she found out that due to long distance between the school and her home, she was scared to walk through the forest roads. Her parents wanted to buy a cycle for her by which she can attend school every day but due to financial problems they are incapable of buying a cycle.

Seema Biswal was able to connect with the situation and came back to the organization without any suggesting.

The day after when she discussed this with the organization, the next day Seema went to the Fasigaan high school and started a charity campaign, she told everyone about the situation so every teacher and students gave some money. Slowly and steadily Seema finally collected the needed money and with those money sikha brought a new by-cycle. These days she is happily going to school everyday. and also attends the exam sincerely. Her parents are also very happy that she can continue her studies.

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
