

## **GC's BIRTH AND UPSURGENGE : & RETROSPECTIVE**

The Ganeswar Club (GC) has to recapitulate the sweet dawn of August 15, 1975 when the juveniles of Bankatia village juxtaposed themselves to play football, arrange sports meets, cultural facts, dramas and celebrate the famous Laxmi Puja which ultimately negotiated an informal social contract between themselves and thus the association was born. Those were the days when they utilized their leisure hours very constructively in playing, repairing village roads and other sanitation work. Their enthusiasm knew no bounds as they self – contributed for various causes but when resource crunch arose approached villagers and elders to meet the deficit. A time so arrived when the successors of late Ganeswar Mishra of village Bankatia ventured to donate a piece of land on which the original infrastructure of the organization is located today. (Then only the collective named the association after him as Ganeswar Club). The name of this Organisation was given as such for acts of his benevolence.

In 1980 – 81 the Nehru Yuva Kendra, Dhenkanal (NYK) arranged a Youth leadership training programme at Hindol to which two of our associates were deputed, thus the actual development phase of GC was founded and link with the NYK developed. When Mr. R. N. Das joined as Youth Coordinator, NYK we got enough moral lift and even programme support to give a boost to our activities. With support from NYK we have organized:-

- One – act play competitions based on social issues.
- Rural sports meets.
- Tailoring training for women.
- Work camps etc.

### **Mission:-**

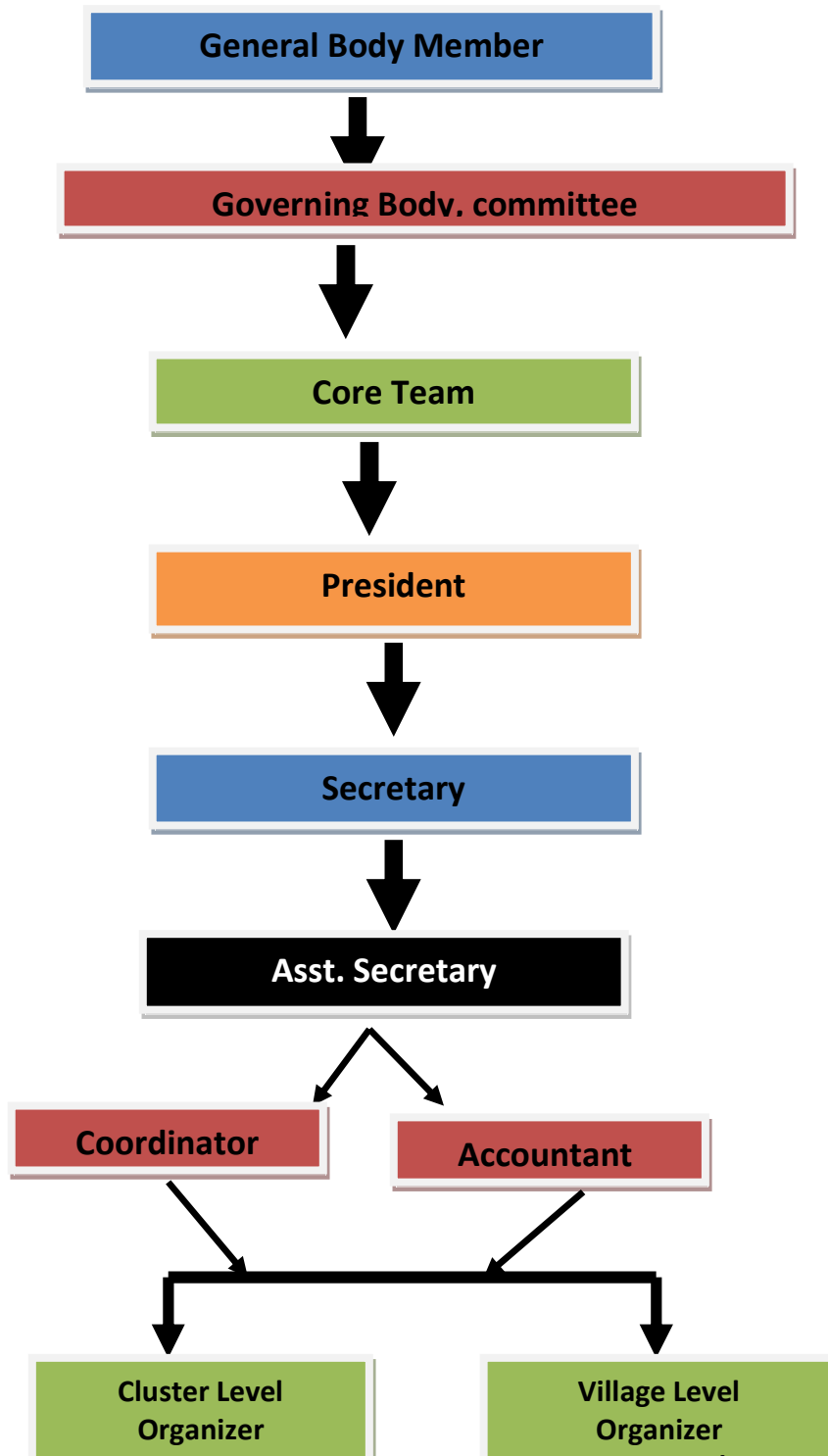

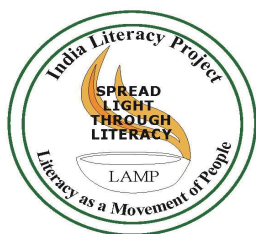

### **Child Right Club (CRC):-**

The aim of the child right club is to give a voice to excluded children and promote their right. In partnership with SAVE CHILDREN, we are promoting 50 children's club, called as "SISUSABHA" where involving more than 2,000 children. We have prepared a theme on 12<sup>th</sup> month. Through which children are acquired about many more things like child rights, cleanness, discrimination, festivals. Through this activity we have succeed in many things. Children have more helped to us. We have reduced dropout in our covered area. Apart from this, we stopped child marriage etc.

### **Kishori Club:-**

Ganeswara club sponsors clubs for adolescents. These clubs provide opportunities for youth to participate in activities, interact with peers in a supervised setting, and form relationships with adults. Some clubs focus on a specific area, thus allowing members to develop their skills and interest in that area. Other clubs provide an array of activities from which children and adolescents can choose. In our covered area we formed 30nos of adolescent clubs which we called “KISHORI CLUB”, where 500 girls are involving. This club meeting functions in every month, where we discuss many more things on the basis of adolescent girls, which thing will be helpful for them.

### **Scholarship Support:-**

Scholarship scheme for providing financial support to students. This is helped to him/her for higher study. We are working in remote area where all citizens are backward people. There is more Occurred CHILD MARRIAGE. Parents are not giving importance on GIRL CHILD EDUCATION. They thought that those girls are nothing, only for to be a bride. To aware those parents and also stop child marriage we are incentive some amount towards education. So in our covered area we have supported scholarship 71nos of students for higher study. We have been starting this activity from 2016- 2017.
